UCAS Results Day 2024: Record acceptances for UK 18-year-olds



Data from UCAS on 19th September reveals 277,790 UK 18-year-olds have been accepted as undergraduates, up from 270,350 (+2.8%) in 2023. The overall number has been driven by UK 18-year-olds, while there is a decline in mature and international students getting a place. Mature acceptances (UK aged 21 and over) have declined, while total international acceptances are marginally down. 
