Supported/inclusive apprenticeships – an introduction



Following the 2016 Maynard Review, changes have been made to the English and maths requirements for apprentices with Learning Difficulties or Disabilities (LDD). The minimum English and maths requirements needed to complete an apprenticeship has been adjusted to Entry Level 3 Functional Skills. This means that for people with LLD who are able to meet the occupational standard of their apprenticeship but will struggle to achieve the regular

English and maths minimum requirements, there is an option to complete Entry Level 3 Functional Skills instead. Many apprenticeship opportunities that allow apprentices to complete Entry Level 3 Functional Skills instead are often termed 'supported apprenticeships' or 'inclusive apprenticeships'. Many employers offer inclusive apprenticeships and reasonable adjustments but finding useful tools to explore occupations and disability confident employers can be challenging. The following two websites can help with this by sharing:

- <u>Devon Your Futures</u>: information and tips on different job types, organisations that may employ you, working environment, starting salary and general entry requirements. An easy to use 3-colour traffic light system allows users to find out quickly if formal qualifications would be required.
