The volunteers at MOJ are keen to visit your school virtually or face to face in the future to run a session with pupils to increase awareness, build confidence and start to raise awareness to the Civil Service. The Social Mobility Programme works with schools which have an FSM (Free School Meals) percentage of 20% or more, to deliver events that highlight what the Civil Service is and why it could be considered as a possible career path.
